



## Analysis of the Application of Politeness Maxims and Cost-benefit in Comment Section LinkedIn

**Abstract.** This study explores the use of Leech's politeness maxims and the cost-benefit principle in LinkedIn comments about job postings, aiming to understand how job seekers maintain politeness when pursuing job opportunities in a professional digital environment. The research objects used were comments in 5 job postings. Using a descriptive qualitative approach, the comments on the LinkedIn platform were analysis and classified based on the 6 maxims proposed by Leech: Tact Maxim, Generosity maxim, Approbation Maxim, Modesty Maxim, Agreement Maxim and Sympathy Maxim. The findings showed that out of a total of 31 data found, the Tact Maxim (32%) was the most common, followed by Approbation Maxim (16%), Generosity maxim (13%), Modesty Maxim (13%), Agreement Maxim (3,2%) and Sympathy Maxim (3,2%). Further cost-benefit analysis revealed that most of the comments showed a lack of politeness, focusing only on personal benefits without providing benefits to the interlocutor.

### 1. INTRODUCTION

Communication is a process of interaction that cannot be separated from everyday human life (Fatimayin, 2018). Along with the times, communication is done through digital media that allows us to communicate in real time. One of them is how people interact and communicate with companies or institutions in the context of job applications. Social media platforms are used in posting job vacancies, such as LinkedIn. LinkedIn is the largest professional network used by companies to recruit employees and enable communication between companies and candidates (Marcu, 2025). This strategy encourages communication interaction between job applicants in every job application post uploaded by the company. The communication interactions that occur in the comments involve language appropriateness and politeness in formal contexts such as job applications (Holmes & Stubbe, 2015). Previous research also highlights that LinkedIn influences networking success, which indirectly shapes communication opportunities. This is in addition to LinkedIn's role as a recruitment site (Davis, Wolff, Forret, & Sullivan, 2020). Further evidence of LinkedIn's impact on professional communication comes from studies showing that certain message components like hashtags, tags, and follower count substantially affect engagement on LinkedIn postings (Usera & Durham, 2025). In formal communication contexts such as job applications, social media users employ pragmatic strategies to demonstrate politeness and manage interactions in a professional setting (Kamsinah, Natsir, & Aliah, 2024).

Politeness in digital communication plays a crucial role in online interactions and outcomes. On social media, users employ principles of politeness to reinforce their expressions in order to maintain harmonious communication and show respect for others (Rahmadani, Difani, Fuaddah, Dafa, & Harina, 2025). In online labor markets, polite direct messaging can significantly increase a worker's chances of being hired, especially for those with less experience or job fit (Hong, Peng, Burtch, & Huang, 2020).

Politeness is an important aspect of human communication, serving as a mechanism to navigate social interactions and maintain relationships (Dewanti, 2022). Over the past five years, research has expanded significantly, exploring various dimensions of politeness, including its strategies, its implications in different contexts, and its role in educational setting. Politeness is an important aspect of society, because politeness is used to recognize the socio-culture in a community in a region (Maharani, 2017) (Muharudin et al., 2023).

The concept of politeness maxims, originally proposed by (Leech, 1983), provides a theoretical framework for understanding how individuals navigate complex social interactions through language. This course provides a basis for exploring how these politeness maxims intersect with cost-benefit analysis in the context of LinkedIn usage. On the other hand, (Leech, 1983) the principle of politeness is to minimize the expression of impolite beliefs and maximize the expression of polite beliefs, which are slightly less important. The principle of politeness proposes a way to build a sense of community and social relationships (Valentina & Mulatsih, 2024).

LinkedIn and other professional networking sites have become essential venues for job searching and career advancement in the digital age. Among the various social media platforms, LinkedIn stands out as a powerful tool for business networking and development (Milosević et al. 2023), with a presence in 200 countries, 58.4 million organizations, and more than 900 million registered users of the platform (LinkedIn 2023). The site is based on principles such as connecting with other members, publishing updates, liking and sharing content, and sending direct messages. The member's profile automatically becomes a resume with work experience, recommendations, achievements, and references. In addition, members can search for and apply for jobs (Dinath, 2021). In addition to helping people connect professionally, these platforms also provide spaces for intricate social interactions, especially in the job posting comments section. These exchanges offer a wealth of opportunities to study linguistic phenomena, particularly how politeness techniques are used in business settings.

This study examines the comments on LinkedIn job postings through the lens of Leech's politeness maxims, with particular attention to the cost-benefit dimension. The platform's public nature, combined with its professional context, creates a distinctive setting where users must carefully craft their responses to maintain face while pursuing their professional goals. By analyzing these comments, we can better understand how job seekers navigate the delicate balance between self-promotion and politeness, and how the cost-benefit principle influences their linguistic choices in professional digital discourse.

## 2. LITERATURE REVIEW

There are six politeness maxims proposed by Leech (1983):

- a. **Tact maxim** is a maxim that minimizes expressions of belief that imply harm to others; maximizes expressions of belief that imply benefit to others. Then ask the speaker to be attentive and polite, most often by repeating the request or statement in a way that minimizes discomfort for the listener. It is usually found in several utterances such as commanding, inviting, offering, etc.
- b. **Generosity maxim** is a maxim that minimizes self-benefit and maximizes self-harm in communication. This principle encourages selflessness and consideration of others in interactions. This maxim minimizes benefits for oneself which means like sacrifices for others while the Tact maxim optimizes benefits for others.
- c. **Approbation maxim** minimize expressions of belief that express criticism of others; maximize expressions of belief that express praise of others. This maxim instructs speakers to avoid negative statements and prioritize positive statements. So that other people will feel appreciated and supported.
- d. **Modesty Maxim** is a maxim that reduces or emphasizes the importance of lowering self-praise and maximizing self-condemnation. This maxim aims to show a humble attitude and avoid arrogance. Speakers are expected not to boast about themselves and tend to underestimate their abilities or achievements.
- e. **Agreement Maxim** highlights the appropriateness of speech between speakers. By agreeing on the appropriateness of the conversation, the speaker and the opponent will try to find a common point that will avoid the differences that occur so that the interaction feels more harmonious and polite.
- f. **Sympathy maxim** expects sympathy from the speaker towards the interlocutor. The concern shown by the speaker reflects a friendly attitude that avoids cynicism or demeaning others.

In addition to the six maxim, Leech (1983) also argued that politeness has to do with cost and benefit in a communication. He calls it one of the politeness scales, namely politeness measured by how much the action or utterance in a conversation benefit or costs the speaker or interlocutor. According to him, speech that tends to provide benefits and advantages to the interlocutor is more polite than speech that is more beneficial to the speaker. This scale helps illustrate how politeness is seen in terms of sacrifice or attention to the interests of others.

The discussion related to politeness maxim has been conducted by several researchers to analyze the application of politeness maxim principles in daily conversation, whether in films, digital content, and digital conversations. One of the studies conducted by (Tampubolon, Rangkuti, & Nasution, 2021), highlighted the types and functions of several politeness maxims used in a digital content on YouTube, namely “The Kelly Clarkson Show”. The study shows that in the YouTube content, maxim types are used that focus on the Maxims of Approbation, Agreement, and Modesty. This research reveals that the Approbation Maxim is a useful maxim to show a culture of praise and positivity through an interaction. In addition, the research identifies the convivial and collaborative functions of these maxims can improve communication and maintain politeness during the exchange of opinions in the show.

Another relevant study was conducted by (Johari et al., 2019), who examined the use of the strategies and maxims combination pattern in relation to Malay politeness characteristics in a radio talk show entitled “Celik Mata, Reset Minda Orang yang Tenang (Open Your Eyes, Reset Your Mind, Calm People) broadcast by IKIMfm. This study analyzed the interactions between the host, invited guests, and caller by using Brown and Levinson’s (1987) politeness theory and Grice’s (1975) maxims. The results showed that the participants applied a combination of strategies and maxim to achieve a conflict-free communication of strategies and maintain politeness in various conversational contexts. This study emphasizes that the principle of politeness can be applied in media discourse to maintain harmony and mutual respect in public communication.

Similarly, (Kosasih, Sunitha, Dilla, & Rahayu, 2024) studied the application of politeness maxims in the “Real Time with Bill Maher Talk Show”, analysing conversations between William Maher and Elon Musk. They found out that the Tact and Sympathy maxims were particularly prevalent, indicating that close relationships in a professional interaction often involve minimizing harm to others while maximizing mutual benefit. This research underscores the importance of tactful communication, especially when navigating complex social exchanges in professional settings.

Align with that, (Rohana, 2022) research provides a broad examination of politeness maxims, focusing on the realization of the Tact, Generosity, Approbation, Modesty, Agreement, and Sympathy maxims. Analysing speeches from the general public, the study categorizes polite speech based on adherence to these maxims, revealing both compliance and violations within everyday language use. The researcher's finding highlights the benefit of these maxims in creating polite exchanges, while also addressing instances where violations occur, offering insights into the social cost of impoliteness.

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Additionally, research conducted by (Suryani & Suastini, 2022) examines the application of politeness maxims in the 2020 movie "Emma". She used Leech's (1983) framework to identify six types of maxims and five scales, with particular emphasis on the maxims of agreement and the cost-benefit scale. The research reveals how conversational purpose and social hierarchy influence the use of each type of maxim. She argues that characters navigate their relationships in the context of 18th-century English society in different ways, which deepens the understanding of the dynamics of politeness in cinematic dialog.

Furthermore, research conducted by (Nurdiyani & Sasongko, 2022) investigated politeness in digital communication, specifically in the WhatsApp application. This study focuses on investigating the linguistic forms and principles of politeness in WhatsApp messages between students and lecturers. The results of this study revealed that students predominantly used the maxims of Wisdom, Humility, and Agreement, indicating a respectful communication style, although the maxim of Generosity was underused. The findings show that in general students have complied with the norms of politeness, and the maxim of generosity has the potential to be improved.

By paying attention to those politeness studies and the results presented, it shows that this research needs to be done because it uses different objects of study and discussion. This study uses Leech's (1983) theory which focuses on the politeness maxim used in communication, especially in the context of communication in finding a job through comments on LinkedIn platform posts. In addition, this study also relates the cost-benefit scale to dig deeper into how cost-benefit in communication to analyze the level of politeness in the comments of job applicants on social media who respond to job vacancy posts. Using Leech's

theory of maxims and politeness scale, this study aims to assess how applicants use various expressions to interact with companies. The results of this study are expected to provide insights into how applicants convey job interest in a polite and professional manner, as well as provide recommendations to improve the quality of applicants' communication in the context of job search on digital platforms.

### **3. METHOD**

The approach used in this research is a descriptive qualitative approach. Qualitative research, according to (Creswell & Creswell, 2018) is a method that is used to understand and explore the meaning given by groups or individuals made of human social issues. Because the data being examined in this study are utterances that will be described descriptively, the qualitative research is examined. As stated as (Creswell & Creswell, 2018), qualitative research is often framed in terms of the use of words rather than the statistical number. Stated alternatively, qualitative research is defined as a study that focuses on describing in a descriptive manner, typically through written data, speech, or human behaviour.

The data collected in this research were taken from the LinkedIn comment section, where users engage in professional interactions that often require a balance between self-promotion and politeness. The comments collected from LinkedIn job postings provide a natural setting to observe how individuals navigate this balance, particularly through the lens of Leech's politeness maxims and the cost-benefit principle. Each comment serves as a data point to analyse linguistic choices and strategies for maintaining professional courtesy while pursuing personal career goals. To delve deeper into the social context, our analysis on this study will pay further attention to the cost-benefit dimension in every comment. Which means that each comment will be evaluated based on the use of maxims and how the cost-benefit principle is applied. In this way, research can reveal how LinkedIn users consider the politeness aspect in achieving their professional goals.

#### 4. FINDING AND DISCUSSION

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## 5. DISCUSSION

In this research, comments on LinkedIn were classified based on six pragmatic maxims proposed by Leech: Tact Maxim (TM), Generosity Maxim (GM), Approbation Maxim (AM), Modesty Maxim (MM), Agreement Maxim (AGM), and Sympathy Maxim (SM). Each of these maxims will help us to evaluate and provide an analysis of how the comments contained in LinkedIn fulfill the principles of politeness in professional communication.

Tact Maxim (TM), there are many comments that fulfilled this maxim because they try not to offend or make assumptions that can offend the company. Some examples, comments such as “Apakah masih ada lowongan nya” (“Are there still any job openings?”) and “Apakah ada kesempatan bagi fresh graduates untuk posisi ini?” (Is there an opportunity for fresh graduates for this position?) In the example comment above, successfully showing attention to

the needs of other parties, which is none other than the Indofood company whose context is posting job vacancies on LinkedIn. These comments are not demanding, but simply asking for information related to available positions, showing that the author understands the importance of respecting the company's role in the selection process. Maxim's tact in these comments makes communication sound polite and not forced, which has the potential to give a good impression to the recruiter.

The Generosity Maxim (GM) category emphasizes personal sacrifice for the benefit of others. In the data collected, comments that fit this category are rarer and harder to find, but there are some examples, such as. "Saya bantu Up! Supaya teman-teman yang terkoneksi dengan saya bisa mencoba peluang ini." (I'll help promote this! So that those connected with me can seize this opportunity.) These comments reflect a concern for other jobseekers who voluntarily share job information and demonstrate a generous attitude. On the other hand, the absence of GM-type comments suggests that most users are more focused on their own self-interest than on helping others. This may be due to the nature of LinkedIn as a professional platform, where users focus more on their personal achievements than on sharing information or opportunities with others.

The Approbation Maxim (AM) minimizes expressions of trust that express criticism of others. In the data, there are comments that lead to Approbation Maxim. Such as, "I am interested in doing business with your good company" and "I am interested to be a part of pt indofood company as a procurement supervisor" (Saya tertarik ingin jadi bagian perusahaan pt indofood sebagai supervisor procurement). Maxim Approbation principle in that there is an accent on appreciation towards the company and avoidance of criticism. Business communication needs to minimize the statements that could be interpreted as critique, thus making it more positive and collaborative. The expression of respect and appreciation is emphasized here, it could favorably influence professional relations and further possibilities of collaboration.

Modesty Maxim (MM), is consistently demonstrated through comments that subtly convey the information without assertively promoting the commenter's life qualifications, highlighting respect for the company's decision-making process. In comment 17, the commentator mentioned: "Saya sudah lamar ke gabian ini ya" and in comment 19, the other commentator mentioned: "Saya sudah melamar, monggo untuk dilihat" offers updates on the applicant's status without any hint of self-assertion, signaling a polite acknowledgement of the employer's role. Similarly, in comment 24, there's a commentator that stated: maaf jika ada

lowongan kerja, Ijasah SMP usia 40 mohon infonya” reflects modesty by openly acknowledging limitations in education and age, without expressing entitlement to a position, while still respecting the employer’s criteria. Together, these comments uphold the modesty maxim’s emphasis on humility, ensuring that communication remains polite, and mindful of the recruiter’s authority.

Agreement Maxim (AGM), principle emphasizes the importance of minimizing disagreement between parties while maximizing agreement in communication. From the data analysis, the Agreement Maxim (AGM) principle is reflected in just one comment. The second comment illustrates this: "Can I become your agent in my Country Kiribati Islands. I was in here for studied in Indonesia for one year and I wil back soon after finishing my course in December Insha Allah.” In an attempt to reach an agreement, the commentator asked the corporation if it would consider making him an agent in the foreign nation where he resided. This demonstrates an effort to provide a particular proposition while coordinating with the company's possible expansion ambition. However, as noted in the cost-benefit analysis, this comment was considered impolite because it focused more on personal benefits rather than mutual advantages.

Sympathy Maxim (SM), focuses on minimizing antipathy and maximizing sympathy between the speaker and hearer. According to the findings, only one comment exemplified the Sympathy Maxim (SM). The following is clear from remark 18: "I'm interested." By expressing interest in the company's posting, the comment demonstrates sympathy. Although this comment is straightforward, it lacks a courteous or respectful tone that may have been enhanced, as the analysis points out. Due to its brevity and lack of effort or sacrifice to demonstrate regard for the company's demands, the remark is deemed unfriendly. This implies that there was little actual empathy or comprehension for the company's viewpoint or needs among the remarks that were examined.

The cost-benefit approach in politeness analysis highlights how much politeness is shown through providing benefits to others, and in return imposing higher costs. In the context of this comment on a job posting, the applicant/commenter acts as the speaker and the company as the interlocutor. In terms of Cost-benefit, as people looking for a job, most commenters do not show politeness. Commenters mostly asked for benefits and imposed costs on the company by giving them a job in the company. In contrast, the few comments that provided clear information or benefits to the company were considered more polite, as they were not only focused on personal gain, but also showed respect and sacrifice that could be appreciated.

## 6. CONCLUSION

This research analyses LinkedIn comments through Leech's six politeness maxims: Tact, Generosity, Approbation, Modesty, Agreement, and Sympathy, highlighting their significance in fostering professional communication. Findings indicate that while Tact is prevalent, with the commenter respectfully seeking information, Generosity is less frequently observed, reflecting a self-focused approach in job-seeking behaviour. Approbation is evident as many comments express appreciation for companies, by minimizing criticism. The modesty maxim is exemplified by application statuses with humility, acknowledging the company's role in the selection process. Although Agreement and Sympathy Maxims appear less frequently they illustrate attempts to align with corporate benefit analysis reveals that while many commenters prioritize personal gain, those who provide information or show respect toward the company enhance their politeness and professional appeal. This analysis underscores the importance of politeness maxims in improving communication dynamics on professional platforms like LinkedIn, by promoting positive impressions on potential employers.

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
